Several Black groups in Camden are homeless.

Dec. '85 C. of E. release 'Faith in the City', a document about inner city deprivation.

The Church has been talking about aiding the Inner City for years. Here is their chance.

Prior to the C.U.T. being established the building was unused and derelict for over 5 years.

Jan. '86 C.U.T. members are issued with eviction order by the C. of E.

Within 3 months 12 groups have held as many events involving over 500 people.
